We have a vacancy for an Early Career Rep!

The SRF values the views and opinions of its Early Career members, and therefore includes two Early Career Rep (formerly known as Postgrad/Postdoc Rep) positions on the SRF Council. This is a great opportunity to see the workings of the Society and get involved in decision making which shapes the future of the SRF.

One of our current Early Career Reps, Belinda Lo (University of Oxford) will be finishing early this summer, while Kacie Thomson (Imperial College London) will finish her term by January 2018.

An 18-month term is available from this July onwards (ending January 2019), and is open to all current Early Career Members.

As an Early Career Rep, you will attend Council meetings where you represent the views and concerns of postgraduate students, postdoctoral scientists, and other early career scientists. During these 18 months, the Early Career Rep will sit on the Education and Engagement Committee for 6 months, and then the Programme Committee for the remainder of the term. The Early Career Reps also help to organise Early Career events at the annual Fertility meetings such as the SRF Early Career Researcher Symposium.

- Full name and institution
- What you would bring to the role including any goals for your term as an Early Career Representative
- Brief details about yourself including your research and interest in reproductive biology

Deadline for statements is: Midnight, Friday 30 June 2017. The statement should be sent by email to srf@conferencecollective.co.uk.

Candidate's statements will be available to view on the SRF website and, subject to more than one application being received, all Early Career Members will be sent a unique link in early July, to then vote online to elect the next Early Career Rep.
