Conference attended: 7th Conference of the International Society of Wildlife Endocrinology (ISWE) held in the Kruger National Park, South Africa from the 13th-16th October 2019

Poster title: Urinary biomarkers of pregnancy and pregnancy-loss detection in the giant panda

I am very grateful to the SRF for providing me with a travel grant to help attend the 7th ISWE conference held in the Kruger National Park in South Africa. Not only was it a chance to meet with some of the leading experts in the field of wildlife endocrinology, but it allowed me to visit a part of the world where I wouldn't otherwise have had the opportunity to.
